Happy Easter to you and your families,

We know we are living a rather Passion-like time rather than a Resurrection one. But even during this time of pandemic, there are so many good reasons to celebrate Easter. Easter is a time for us to remember that God in His lasting Love, has given us life in Christ; an everlasting life that, when we abide in faith, we are strengthened by the hope of a better life, we are reminded that God's plan of salvation is always at work. Faith increases our hope in God's eternal Kingdom of peace and in our unity in the love God offers us in Christ.

Sometimes we would like to find God in our own ways, sending him SOS alerts, while we just remain still and waiting for his response, feeling that He has abandoned us; we want to listen God only through good news.
